CLASS RANKINGS AND GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The official grade point average (GPA) of graduating students is based on a minimum of 8 semesters of studies in order to allow students sufficient opportunity for demonstrating achievement. Temporary GPA's will be sent to colleges and universities who request information for admission. GPA is only used on 9th — 12th grade students to establish class rank.

The official GPA will be furnished to post-secondary institutions upon request.

At graduation the district will recognize Honor Students that have a total grade percentage average for the four years of 93% or above.

The district will name a Valedictorian based solely upon class rank using the GPA system. The Valedictorian shall be the student earning the highest GPA and having a minimum of 2 semesters of enrollment in the district. The district will name a Salutatorian who earns the second highest GPA and having a minimum of 2 semesters of enrollment in the district.

The GPA will be based on a 4.0 grade system and will be outlined in student handbook with school board approval.
